

Honesty Looks Like Bulletin Board

This project focuses on integrity through honesty. Students will illustrate a picture of them being honest and write or dictate a sentence to explain how they practice honesty. The teacher will take a picture of each student and have them cut out their face and glue it onto their picture to personalize it. The teacher will then create a bulletin board to promote Honesty as the school year continues.

Integrity Sub-Concept(s)

Kindness

Project Timeframe

25-30 minutes

Required Materials

- ☐ Integrity Handbook pages (see attached)
- ☐ Camera
- ☐ Bulletin Board Supplies

Students will illustrate their understanding of honesty through the creation of a self portrait of them being honest in a real life situation. Explain that students will receive the template below and will need to choose one personal example of honest behavior to draw.

As a class, brainstorm examples of honest behavior. Examples might include:

- Admitting to breaking something, like a vase or lamp.
- Showing up on time for school.
- Saying sorry when you hurt someone's feelings.
- Telling the teacher when something unsafe is happening on the playground.
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Create your own Honesty Portrait with your picture glued on as a sample for them to better understand how to scale their art.

Explain each step in this project:**Step 1- Draw your Honesty Self-Portrait**

Think back to a time when you were honest. Maybe you admitted to doing something wrong, you apologized to a friend, or you worked hard to be on time back to class after recess. Draw that picture, but leave room for your face photo- it will go in there as well so we know exactly who is Honest!

Step 2- Write a sentence/Dictate what's happening.

Add a sentence to explain what is happening in the picture. If the student needs help, have them dictate to the teacher as needed.

Step 3- Take a photo/Add the photo

The teacher will take a photograph of each student. After it is printed, students will cut out their face and glue it into the self-portrait.

Step 4- Bulletin Board creation

The teacher will create a simple bulletin board that is titled, "Honesty looks like..." and then hang all the self-portraits up for viewing by everyone in the school as a reminder of honest actions.

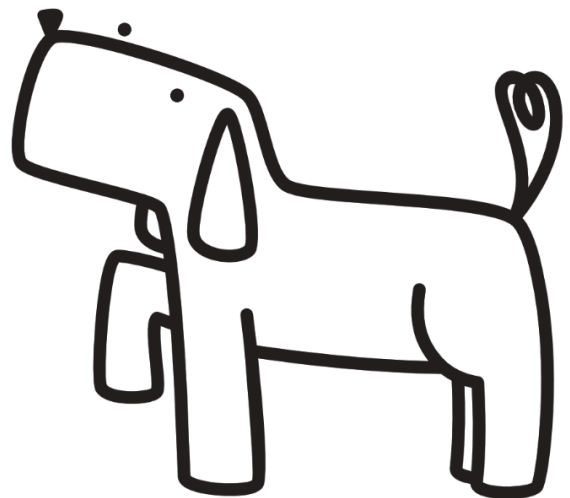
