Respect Role Plays

This project helps students review the main concepts from the Respect unit while giving them physical and tangible opportunities to practice kindness and respect with their peers.

Self-care, Kindness

Project Timeframe

25-30 minutes

Required Materials

Project Details:

Put students in pairs or groups of three. Pass the scenarios out amongst the groups; it is ok if more than one group acts out the same skit. You can use that as an opportunity to remind students that there are many ways to show respect and kindness. You can also think of your own scenario ideas.

Give students 10 minutes to prepare their short role play or skit. Then invite students to act their scenario out in front of the class. Comment on how easy it is to be respectful and kind!

Scenario 1	Helping a classmate who is upset
Scenario 2	Taking turns and sharing on the playground
Scenario 3	Using polite words and listening when others speak
Scenario 4	Respecting personal space and belongings
Scenario 5	Keeping the classroom clean
Scenario 6	Helping a teacher
Scenario 7	Following classroom rules
Scenario 8	Picking up litter around the school playground
Scenario 9	Apologizing for breaking something in the classroom
Scenario 10	Welcoming a new classmate on their first day

End with a class discussion on what everyone learned from the skits and this unit and how these examples of respect can be applied in real life.
