

Hello Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to Unit 2 of our Kindness in the Classroom curriculum. For the next 4-6 weeks we will be learning all about CARING. Since this is a very familiar concept for children this age, we will expand on the following topics:

TOPIC	QUESTIONS WE'LL BE EXPLORING	HOW YOU CAN HELP AT HOME
Self-Care	<ul> <li>How can we increase our level of personal self-care? What parts of our daily routine demonstrate some type of self-care?</li> </ul>	Talk with your child about how important self-care is as you grow older. Discuss the consequences of poor self-care (cavities, skin problems, etc.)
Helpfulness	<ul> <li>How can we use our time and talent to help others, even without being asked? How does helping without asking inspire kindness in our family?</li> </ul>	Discuss different ways your child can help at home. What areas need more help and how can they assist in a way that you find truly helpful?
Gratitude	<ul> <li>How do our words and actions show others we are thankful for who they are and what they do for us?</li> </ul>	Help your child practice showing gratitude towards both adults and children in their lives using kind words.
Compassion	<ul> <li>How do we show compassion to others our own age? How do we demonstrate compassion for adults that are struggling? What does compassion look like to you?</li> </ul>	Talk with your child about people in their school that may be struggling. Brainstorm ways they can show compassion for them.
Empathy	<ul> <li>What is empathy? How are compassion and empathy connected?</li> </ul>	Connect your child with opportunities for them to feel empathy for others that are going through similar situations. Example- talk with a friend going through a divorce, make a get well card for a sick friend, etc.

- Create an affirmation stone!
- Make a Caring comic strip!
- Develop Compassion through Role Plays!
- Explore empathy through art appreciation!
