TOPIC	QUESTIONS WE'LL BE EXPLORING	HOW YOU CAN HELP AT HOME
You are Special	<ul> <li>What makes each of us special?</li> <li>How can we celebrate our uniqueness?</li> </ul>	Talk with your child about what makes them and your family special? How can you embrace the things that are "different" from everyone else?
Teamwork	<ul> <li>Why do we need to work together?</li> <li>How can teamwork help us when we are trying to finish something?</li> </ul>	Brainstorm ways to work with others in the classroom, on the playground, and even at home. What does teamwork look like?
Inclusiveness	<ul> <li>How can we include others, even if we do not know them?</li> <li>Why is it important to give everyone a chance during games and other activities?</li> </ul>	Discuss the connection between inclusiveness and kindness. Emphasize how including others requires kindness. We use our kind words and actions to make them feel welcome!

- Play team building games!
- Practice asking permission to join others!
- Kindness activities to increase inclusivity!
